This program is open to Mass K-12 educators through the Center for Global Education, and to undergraduate and graduate students through the Department of Geography. Course themes have been selected to complement the Massachusetts curriculum frameworks, and include:

- The Golden Age: exploration and colonization
- Netherlands and the EU: current challenges
- Netherlands in a global world: immigration and trade
- Surviving below sea level: mitigation/adaptation strategies
- Resisting totalitarianism: Occupied Netherlands during WWII

Current Course activities and explorations in Amsterdam and Netherlands may include:

- Canal-boat tour centered on history of Amsterdam
- Visit the EU Court of Justice in The Hague
- Rijksmuseum, Rembrandt House, and Van Gogh museums
- Dams, Dykes and Polders – living below sea level
- Visit the EU headquarters in Brussels, Belgium
- The Anne Frank House and Museum of Dutch Resistance

Note: a variety of other activities are possible, depending on the interests and research projects chosen by participants. Resources will be made available to students prior to the first class meeting via Blackboard, so that our pre-travel class time will productively move them towards selection of a research/project topic.

Course meets at Framingham State: July 2 and 3 (pre-travel classwork) and July 30 (final presentations)
